 - Technological Advisory Council

- Need to find a place where wireless regulatory issues are absent!!

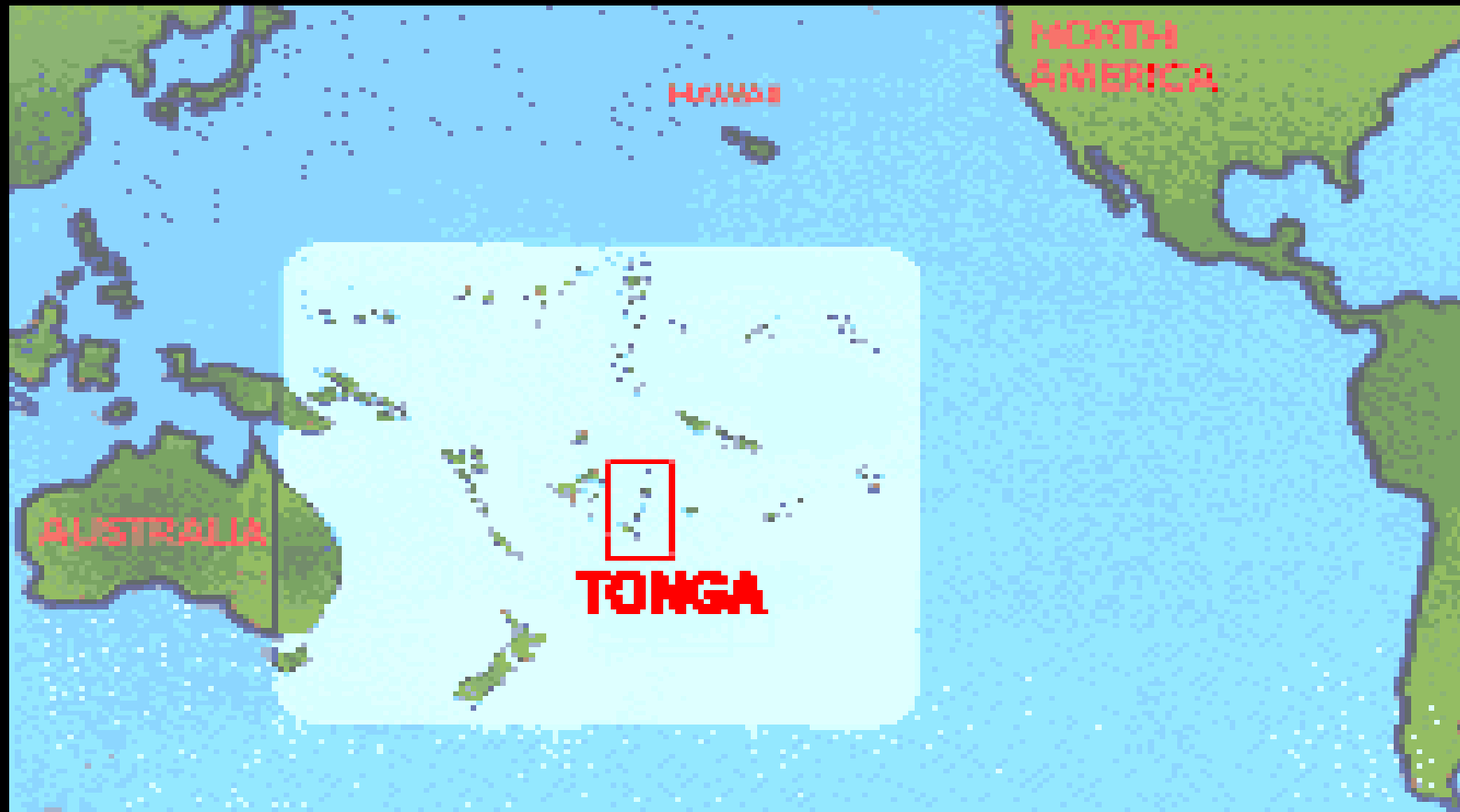


Kingdom of Tonga Project

- Island group in the South Pacific
- About 171 islands, 70 inhabited
- 100K people in Tonga, about the same number outside Tonga
- Agricultural exports main source of \$
- One of the last true monarchies

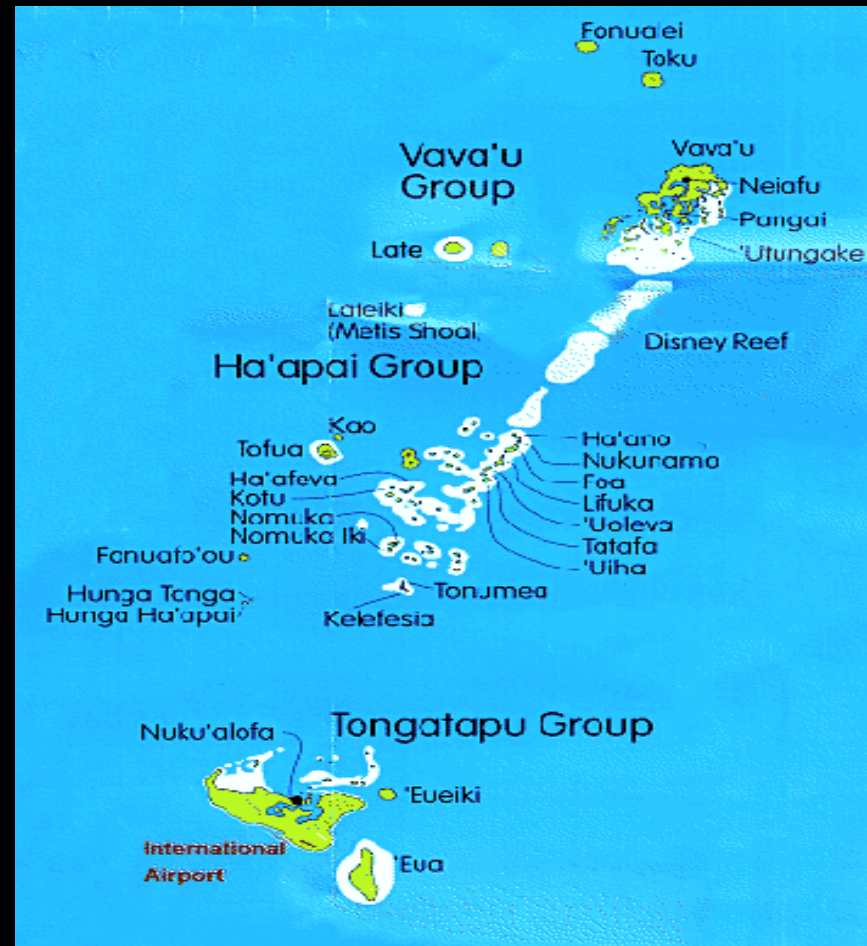


Kingdom of Tonga

The Task

- Business project of the Crown Prince
- Move country from wired to totally wireless infrastructure
- Two Phases
 - International
 - Domestic
- No regulatory issues!!!



Basic Statistics

- 11K Households
- 6500 phone customers
- 8 yr. waiting list to get a phone
- Cable & Wireless handles international
- Tonga Telecom handles domestic



Technology

- **Wireless Multiservices IP Network**
 - Scalable, fully meshed network
- **Use of wideband wireless devices**
 - Spread Spectrum
 - Ultrawideband
- **New two-way VSAT technologies**
- **Support for new Internet appliances**
 - New PDA's
 - Playstation II
- **Goal of CPE cost of about \$450**



Services

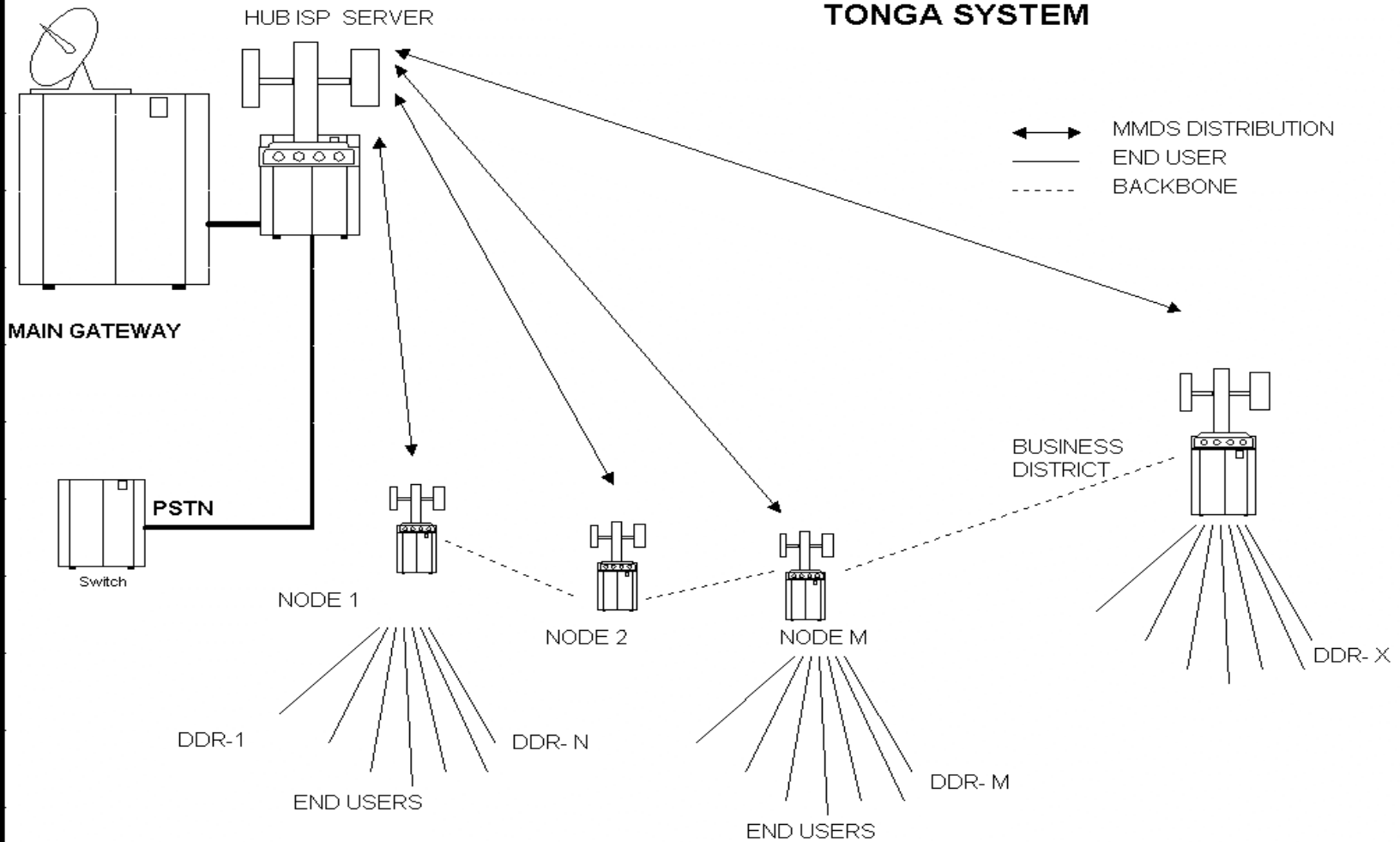
- VoIP for telephony
